<b>Experience Level</b>	You want there to be a good amount of contrast between your precut strips and your background fabric. Other than that there are no rules for this one!

Yes	30 – 2 ½” x width of Fabric (WOF) strips, a design roll works great for this
	30 – 5” x 5” charm squares, these can but do not have to be identical fabrics to the strips above
