Course Overview

Learn the ins and outs of basic embroidery stitches as you embellish a pair of premade tea towels to perk up your kitchen, powder room, or another spot in your home. Learn (or brush-up on) 10 basic stitches and choose your own favorites designs to stitch from the book Lunch-Hour Embroidery: 130 Playful Motifs from A to Z (required). Tips and tricks for transferring designs and tucking in thread tails will be shared, too. It's fun, fast, and best of all, you can FINISH what you start and leave with two adorable tea towels stitched by you!

Required Book

Lunch Hour Embroidery: 130 Playful Motifs from A to Z

Required Fabrics and Supplies

2 yards of 16" wide toweling fabric OR two premade tea towels (please avoid thin floursack toweling and terrycloth/pile towels)

Assorted embroidery floss in your choice of colors (such as DMC, Aurifil embroidery floss, or Valdani 5-weight or 12-weight perle cotton)

The Stitchin' Post carries Sue Spargo 3, 5, and 8 weight elganza perle embroidery thread

Sulky Sticky Fabri-Solvy wash-away stabilizer

Fine-tip marker (such as Pigma Pen)

Embroidery needles: medium-length, sharp, long-eye
(sizes range from 1 (large) to 12 (small), with sizes 7 to 9 being the most popular for embroidery)

Small embroidery scissors or snips

Optional Supplies

Frixion pen (heat erasable)

7" embroidery hoop
