Class Description:

This project is perfect for those Jelly Rolls you bought because they lured you in, but aren't sure what to do with. Half Modern – Half Southwestern, *Flowers For Shirley* is a quick and simple quilt that you can get done quickly. I will be showing other variations of these Flowers in class so that each of your blocks can be unique. Every student will have a quilt that definitely reflects their personality.

Supply List:

sewing machine with $\frac{1}{4}$ inch foot or at least your ability to make accurate $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seams
rotary cutter, cutting mat, and 18" or longer straight ruler.

Thread

Other basic sewing supplies: seam ripper, pins, etc.

Pattern (available at Stitchin' Post website)

A Highly Recommended item to *Flowers for Shirley*:

Doug Leko's Simple Folded Corners Ruler - this ruler is terrific for Sew and Flip Corners.

Fabric list:

2 Jelly Rolls of coordinating 2 1/2" strips – you will have extra but 2 rolls ensures that you will have enough for matched sets and variety

2 1/2" yards of background fabric

Pre-cutting options:

I like to create as we go, so I don't encourage a lot of pre-cutting, but I also know that it helps in getting more done in class.

So to get a lot done in class and create the quilt exactly as pictured you can cut:

10 matched sets of (4) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" B Rectangles

4 matched sets of (3) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" B Rectangles

10 matched sets of (24) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" C Squares

4 matched sets of (12) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" C Squares

144 assorted 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" D Rectangles

BUT if you want to learn some of the varieties I have come up with, don't cut all of these precuts save some of the Jelly roll strips to experiment with in class.

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
